Full-time Holders of Public Office

Salary Packaging

Background

The existing Determination for Full-time Holders of Public Office provides the facility to salary package up to 50% of remuneration in accordance with guidelines issued by the Commissioner for Public Administration.

These arrangements are the same as those for non-Executive staff in the ACT Public Service.

In respect of ACT Public Service staff, the Commissioner for Public Administration issued new guidelines with effect from 1 June 2004 to increase the percentage of remuneration that could be salary packaged from 50% to 75%.

Tribunal Decision

The Tribunal has determined that the maximum amount of remuneration that can be salary packaged for Full-time Holders of Public Office be increased from 50% to 75% with effect from 1 June 2004.

Chief Executive and Executive

Salary Packaging

The Tribunal determines as follows:

Determination 158 is amended by deleting the existing Clause 3.5 and replacing it with:

‘3.5 The scheme is to be based on the ACT Public Service Salary Packaging Policy and Procedures issued by the Commissioner for Public Administration, with no more than 75% of the relevant remuneration shown in Schedule A to be taken as benefits and related costs such as fringe benefits tax.’

This Determination shall take effect from 1 June 2004.
